- **STEP 4:** **Accept or decline the offer by Thursday, February 2, 9:00am via the Qualtrics form found within your email.** If you accept, this information will be shared with the Assignments office. You will be assigned housing in the LLC and you will not be allowed to participate in the remainder of housing selection.

RETURNING PAUL ROBESON MEMBERS (Community Ambassador Program): In order to remain engaged in the community without a course component, all returning members will be engaged with the Paul Robeson Cultural Center for the fall and spring semesters, via a monthly or bi-weekly media review related to Black/African American identities. The media review schedule will be chosen based on all participants and the facilitators availability. You are expected to read, watch or listen to the assigned portions for that month/week and engage in conversation and activities. You will also engage in the creation and facilitation of a service project each semester. You will take part in a mentorship program as a "Big" or Head of Family/informal mentor, if there is an opportunity within the LLC.

ALL MEMBERS WILL:

- You will ACTIVELY PARTICIPATE in **at least two** Living-Learning Community programs per semester created by the LLC staff (e.g. mentor/mentee events, faculty visits). Failure to do so may result in being relocated out of your allocated housing assignment.
- You will participate in two Scarlet Chats (these are conversations to keep your LLC staff abreast of your progress at Rutgers and to help you make connections with your peers) per semester with your community's LLC staff, as well as general community meetings hosted by the LLC staff.
- You will conduct yourself both academically and socially in a manner that is reflective of the spirit of the Living-Learning Community.
- You will abide by all rules, regulations, policies, and procedures as outlined by the Department of Residence Life.
- You will maintain a clean judicial record with the University.
- The LLC is our home. As such, we ask that you respect it by adhering to the Rutgers University Residence Hall Policies that have been set forth for you. If you have disciplinary issues with our Staff or with the Office of Student Conduct, we will reevaluate your continued residence in the hall. You are responsible for reviewing all policies and asking questions if you need clarification. Ask your RA or visit ruoncampus.rutgers.edu for more information.
- You will create a welcoming, friendly environment that allows for cooperative living and learning. You will be respectful of all residents, community participants, faculty, and guests.
- You will adhere to the expectation of utilizing the various academic resources (i.e. participation in study groups, academic advisement, LLC staff, peer relationships conducive to academic success, etc.) made available to me as a member of the Living-Learning Community.
- You will serve as a positive ambassador for living-learning communities at Rutgers University.
